REFLECTING THIS SUNDAY'S READINGS:

I have not come to abolish the law and the prophets but to fulfill them.

Matthew continues the Sermon on the Mount with a three part instruction by Jesus on the Way of Life in the kingdom of heaven. Today's reading is part one and deals with the Law. Part two deals with worship and religious practice and contains the Lord's Prayer. Part three deals with trusting God and deeds of loving service to our neighbor. When Matthew speaks of "the Law and the prophets" he means the whole Scripture. When the Messiah brings the fullness of the kingdom none of scripture will be done away with. Instead it will be fulfilled. Matthew's Jesus does not overturn the Law of Moses, nor does he set his followers free from the Law. He requires his followers to go beyond the Law by doing more than the Law requires. The Law condemned murder. Jesus condemns anger. The Law condemned adultery. Jesus condemns even lustful looks. As Jewish Christians who had always been faithful to the Law Matthew's community need a way to understand the difference Jesus and the kingdom he brings have made. They affirmed that God had always been at work in history through "the Law and the prophets." But God's work goes beyond that to be embodied by the Messiah who reveals the definitive will of God. The written scriptures and their interpretation in tradition are surpassed by Jesus whose life and teaching are the definitive revelation of the will of God.

First Reading

- What are the main points of this passage?
- What idea most stands out to you?
- What imagery does the author use? How does it reinforce each point?
- What questions or concerns does this passage seem to address?
- How do you think Jesus fulfills the law?
- How should Jesus' disciples treat the law?
- How does Jesus revise particular laws?
- Do you think Jesus' commandments are easier or harder than the original laws?
- How might people have reacted to Jesus?
- The following questions zero in on a particular teaching.
 - How do verses 23-24 about anger help you prepare for our eucharistic celebrations?
 - Does our culture support healthy, respectful sexual relationships?
 - What are good and bad reasons for getting married?
 - Do you know anyone who struggles with Jesus' prohibition of divorce?
 - Do you always follow through on what you say you're going to do?
- Which of these teachings do you find especially challenging?

Gospel

- What makes it difficult to do God's will?
- When have you seen particular choices lead either to life or death?

BAPTISM

FIRST EUCHARIST

Preparation sessions for children and parents begin in the fall. We encourage children to be at least in the 2nd grade. Parents must be registered members of the parish. To ensure the required sacramental record keeping, parents must provide a copy of the child's birth certificate and baptismal certificate.

CONFIRMATION

Preparation sessions for children and sponsors begin in the fall. We encourage children to be at least in the 10th grade. Parents must be registered members of the parish. To ensure the required sacramental record keeping, parents must provide a copy of the child's birth certificate and baptismal certificate.

MATRIMONY

We recommend couples notify the parish 6 months in advance. Couples must attend preparation sessions. The groom and bride must be registered members of the parish. To ensure the required sacramental record keeping, groom and bride must provide a copy of their birth certificate, baptismal, first communion, and confirmation certificates.

SICK & HOMEBOUND

If you know someone who cannot attend mass or desires the Sacrament of Anointing, please call the parish office.
