Mary of Magdala finds that the stone has been removed from Jesus' tomb.


Today we begin the Easter Season, our 50-day meditation on the mystery of Christ's Resurrection. Our Gospel today tells us about the disciples' discovery of the empty tomb. It concludes by telling us that they did not yet understand that Jesus had risen from the dead. Thus, the details provided are not necessarily meant to offer proof of the Resurrection. The details invite us to reflect upon a most amazing gift, that is faith in Jesus and his Resurrection. Each of the four Gospels tells us that Jesus' empty . tomb was first discovered by women. This is notable because in firstcentury Jewish society women could not serve as legal witnesses. In the case of John's Gospel, the only woman attending the tomb is Mary of Magdala. Unlike the Synoptic accounts, John's Gospel does not describe an appearance of angels at the tomb. Instead, Mary is simply said to have observed that the stone that had sealed the tomb had been moved, and she runs to alert Simon Peter and the beloved disciple. Her statement to them is telling. She assumes that Jesus' body has been removed, perhaps stolen. She does not consider that Jesus has been raised from the dead. Simon Peter and the beloved disciple race to the tomb, presumably to verify Mary's report. The beloved disciple arrives first but does not enter the tomb until after Simon Peter. This detail paints a vivid picture, as does the detail provided about the burial cloths. Some scholars believe that the presence of the burial cloths in the tomb offers evidence to the listener that Jesus' body had not been stolen (it is understood that grave robbers would have taken the burial cloths together with the body). The Gospel passage concludes, however, that even having seen the empty tomb and the burial cloths, the disciples do not yet understand about the Resurrection. In the passage that follows, Mary of Magdala meets Jesus but • mistakes him for the gardener. In the weeks ahead, the Gospel readings from our liturgy will show us how the disciples came to believe in Jesus' Resurrection through his appearances to them. Our Easter faith is based on their witness to both the empty tomb and their continuing relationship with Jesus-in his appearances and in his gift of the Holy Spirit.

REFLECTING THIS SUNDAY'S READINGS: First Reading


- What are the main aspects of Jesus' story that Peter highlights?
- If people were hearing about Jesus for the first time, what questions might they have asked?
- How might people have reacted differently to the various aspects of Jesus' story?
- Why do you think Mary goes to Jesus' tomb?
- Why is it noteworthy that these events occur while it is still dark?
- What all might Mary be thinking and feeling as she runs to tell the male disciples?
- Why do you think Peter and the other disciple rush to the tomb themselves?
- What exactly do the two male disciples find?
- What are all the explanations Peter might have for what he sees in the tomb?
- What might the three disciples say to each other after they see that Jesus' tomb is empty?
- Do you think either of the two men tell anyone about what happened?

- What parts of Jesus' story would you highlight?
- What part of Jesus' story is the most important to you at this moment in your life?
- What are some reasons people find it difficult to believe that Jesus rose from the dead?
- Why do you think some people find it easier than other people to believe in Jesus?
- How do you think you would have reacted if you had been at the empty tomb?







BAPTISM

Preparation sessions for children and parents begin in the fall. We encourage children to be at least in the 2nd grade. Parents must be registered members of the parish. To ensure the required sacramental record keeping, parents must provide a copy of the child's birth certificate and baptismal certificate.

CONFIRMATION

Preparation sessions for children and sponsors begin in the fall. We encourage children to be at least in the 10th grade. Parents must be registered members of the parish. To ensure the required sacramental record keeping, parents must provide a copy of the child's birth certificate and baptismal certificate.

MATRIMONY

We recommend couples notify the parish 6 months in advance. Couples must attend preparation sessions. The groom and bride must be registered members of the parish. To ensure the required sacramental record keeping, groom and bride must provide a copy of their birth certificate, baptismal, first communion, and confirmation certificates.
